Dear Lakeview Families,

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of school is underway. Our 8<sup>th</sup> graders are preparing to make the leap to high school. Our 7<sup>th</sup> graders are getting ready to move into the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and take over as the leaders of our school. I want to remind 8<sup>th</sup> grade students and parents about the graduation standard and Magic Mountain. Graduation requirements call for an average of a 1.0 for all subjects and no F's in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter, no more than 29 demerits, no U's in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter in conduct and no more than 29 absences if you attended all 180 days. At the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter, the school will start accepting money for our Magic Mountain trip for all 8<sup>th</sup> graders on track for graduation. The cost will be 75 dollars per student (40 dollars if you have your own year's pass to the park). As we move past the mid point of the year, I would like to revisit Dream, Believe, Act and Achieve our vision defined. A simple slogan to remind students that with focus, hard work, support and belief they can realize their Dreams. Teachers developed this and defined it further by stating what Dreaming, Believing, Acting and Achieving would look like and this became a poster that is visible in every classroom. Each year staff leadership creates lessons focused on goal setting, overcoming obstacles, using technology effectively and safely and college/career exploration. These lessons are delivered on our 4 DBAA days. The next DBAA day is March 2<sup>nd</sup>. All students receive simultaneous instruction on the same topics. It unifies the school and helps to solidify our sense of purpose.

Lakeview is holding its next English Language Advisory Committee meeting in partnership with Joe Nightingale Elementary. The meeting is at Joe Nightingale on Tuesday, February 13 and will start at 6 p.m. The focus for Lakeview will be our reading program, 8<sup>th</sup> grade graduation requirements and transition to high school.

Queridas familias de Lakeview,

El tercer semestre está en marcha. Nuestros estudiantes del grado 8 se están preparando para entrar a la high school. Nuestros estudiantes del grado 7 se están preparando para el grado 8 y tomar el control de ser líderes de la escuela. Quiero recordarles a los estudiantes del grado 8 y sus padres sobre el estándar de graduación y de Magic Mountain. Requisitos de graduación es que los estudiantes tengan un promedio de 1.0 en todas las materias, y no F's en el cuarto semestre, menos de 29 deméritos, no U's en el semestre cuatro en conducta, y menos de 29 ausencias, si estuvo registrado los 180 días. Al final del tercer semestre, la escuela comenzara a aceptar dinero para el viaje a Magic Mountain para los estudiantes del grado 8 que van en buen camino a la graduación. El costo será de 75 dólares por estudiante (40 dólares si tiene un pase anual del parque). Al pasar la mitad del año escolar, quiero mencionar de nuevo nuestra visión de Soñar, Creer, Actuar, y Lograr. ## ATTENTION: 8th grade parents

This week, your student received information about Righetti registration. Instead of a set appointment time, registration will take place from 3:30-6:30 in the Righetti Library. Students with last names beginning with A-L will go to the library on Tuesday, February 20, and last names beginning with M-Z will register on February 21. Online enrollment must be completed prior to your registration meeting. Your student has received the forms you see below:

- Step 1** Complete our online enrollment at [www.righetti.us](http://www.righetti.us)
- Information about the student including demographics, emergency contacts and health information will be collected during the online enrollment process.
- Step 2** Provide required documents
- You will need to bring all required documents to the school in order to complete your student's enrollment.
- REQUIRED:**
- Printed confirmation pages from the online enrollment.
  - Completed emergency card.
  - Copy of birth certificate (county or state certificate, not hospital)
  - Copy of two recent utility bills (gas, water, electric) with parent name and address
    - If you do not have utility bills in your name – A landlord affidavit will need to be completed and signed by the homeowner. The homeowner will have to provide a recent utility bill.
  - Copy of complete immunization records (*Please note: Students WILL NOT receive their schedule or start school until completed immunization records have been submitted.*)
  - Copy of transcript/withdrawal grades (does not apply to incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders)
- IF APPLICABLE:**
- *Custody documents* – To show legal and physical custody of student, both parents will have equal access to the student unless court documents are provided.
  - *Legal guardianship documents/Caregiver forms* – Required if someone other than the birth parents are registering the student.
  - *Legal name change documents* – Name listed on the birth certificate will be used unless legal name change documents are provided.
